Dear Maggie Families,

Thank you so much for your tremendous amount of support in the month of March. We had a fabulous month of learning, reading, and fundraising. The students in homeroom classes read over 100 books as class meaning at MTE we read over 2,100 books in the month of March!!!! We enjoyed our Dr. Seuss reading week and our Drop Everything and Read activities. We also had a blast for our PBIS day in early March where kids danced, made Leprechaun traps and made art work for our cafeteria. We even had a picnic with our class. Our PTA Boosterthon Fun Run was a huge success! We also enjoyed seeing our families for our LEAP parent night.

A new leadership training, given by Action Community Resources, took place on Saturday, March 25th. We had approximately 70 students from MTE attend where we learned leadership skills through fun and engaging activities. It was a huge success and it is something we will incorporate next year to give more students an opportunity to participate. Our ultimate goal is to develop leaders in each child so they can build on their strengths to make a positive impact on themselves, their community and this world!

We want to limit distractions and interruptions. Some district assessments will be given to second grade while 3 rd grade is doing their LEAP testing. It is an important time for us to get feedback on student's current academic standing. We ask that parents and guardians have students get an adequate amount of rest during this time. We want students performing their best. The teachers have prepared the students. Please encourage students to try their best and build their confidence by praising the students and telling them you know they will do a great job! We are blessed with a very strong faculty, staff and community. It is our time to shine and I know we will.

Cultural Arts Day is our next big day. This will take place on April 6 th . Incoming parent night and second grade night will be May 2nd at 5:30 PM. Please mark your calendars!

Second Grade

Here we are in the 4th nine weeks! Where has the year gone? Second graders have been super busy in the month of March. They have studies insects and the Civil War. They have learned bout fast and slow land changes and the government. There have been science experiments, a glow dance party for PBIS, leprechaun traps and boosterthon. April will bring about more fun activities and learning opportunities. We will have a busy April with Spring break starting on April 7th and returning on Monday, April 17th.

In ELA knowledge lessons we are going to learn about the human body This domain covers a number of topics regarding the human body. The students will learn how cells form the building blocks of life on Earth. They will learn how cells form tissue and tissues form organs. They will learn about the digestive and excretory systems and how important nutrition is to good health.

In ELA Skills, spelling alternatives: /f/, /er/, /k/, o/, /[]/ will be taught as well as tricky spelling: ea, i, a. Some of the tricky words that will be taught are: Great Britain, Europe, signature, imagine, soldier, iron, special, shoe, early, whose, and new. In grammar, adverbs, run-on sentences, building sentences, and parts of speech will be introduced. The students will work on spelling one and two-syllable words. Finally they will write an informational paragraph and an opinion paragraph.

In math, after learning about graphing data and money, the students will learn about measurement in inches, feet, and yards as well as line plots and real world word problems encapsulating all of these concepts.

In science, students will focus on relationships in habitats. They will be able to identify what plants need to survive and how plants depend on animals. In social studies, we will be learning about our community and its economics as well as its culture.



Third Grade

Third graders are looking forward to an amazing April. We have lots of interesting things to learn in all subjects.

In Math, students will begin studying Module 6, Collecting and Displaying Data. Students apply their knowledge of fractions from Unit 5 as they estimate lengths to the nearest halves and fourths of an inch and record that information in bar graphs and line plots. Students answer "how many more" and "how many less" questions about scaled bar graphs. Please continue to practice flash cards at home to help ensure their multiplication fluency.

In ELA, students will study the elements of Cajun folktales with Lapin Plays Possum. While exploring literary and informational texts, students will learn how storytelling can be entertaining, as well as, educational. Students will learn more about Louisiana history and culture, as well as, character and theme development. Students will write stories modeled after Tall Tales and Folk Tales.

In Social Studies, students investigate the relationship between different economic concepts and the role of individuals in the economy. Students will be discussing economic vocabulary. They will be participating in discussions on how our choices play a role in economics.

In Science, students will begin their study of fossils. Students will develop models to describe that organisms have unique and diverse life cycles but all have in common birth, growth and death. Our school year has really flown by and spring fever will be creeping in soon. Please continue to remind your child to work hard and stay focused.

LEAP Testing will be April 26-May 3. Please do not schedule appointments for these dates.

How to Add Mindfulness to Your Child's Day

Many adults are able to recognize feelings of anxiety, stress and frustration, but when children and teenagers experience these emotions, they are often less equipped to deal with them.

As we as parents and caregivers work to manage and reduce stress in our everyday life, we should help our children do the same. Mindfulness is often taught in schools to help students navigate their feelings and emotions and you can also practice mindfulness at home to reduce stress and anxiety.

Although the idea may seem abstract at first, weekly practice and modeling can help your child learn how to manage their thoughts, feelings and emotions. It will also help bond your relationships and provide more moments for open conversation.

Here are a few activities you can do as a family to adopt mindfulness into your daily routine.

The Mind Jar Snow Globe

Help your children avoid emotional blizzards with this mindfulness practice. First, have them imagine their thoughts and worries are like snowflakes being shaken in a snow globe. Guide them in breathing slowly and visualizing their negative feelings falling down.

As the snowflakes begin to rest on the ground, so too settles their mind. Finally, enjoy spending a mindful minute to remember and imprint these feelings of positivity and serenity.

Listening to the Rain

Simple sounds like rain drops falling through the trees can be calming and relaxing. This mindfulness practice uses a guided meditation to clear your head and bring awareness to your surroundings. Whenever your child appears overwhelmed or agitated, try listening together to audio of failing rain.

Rainbow Walk

Helping children become aware of what's going on around them at any particular moment can help strengthen their focus and calm their mind. Provide them with time to really explore their environment, noticing the details of their surroundings, indoors or outdoors. Ask them to make a list (verbally or on paper) of objects they see, and have them organize them by color, so that they make their own version of a rainbow.
